SHOW REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE CONDUCT OF EXHIBITIONS AND SHOWS
HELD BY THE HORTICULTURAL DEPARTMENT OF THE
ROYAL JERSEY AGRICULTURAL & HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY
(EXHIBITORS NOT COMPLYING WITH THESE REGULATIONS WILL BE SUBJECT TO DISQUALIFICATION)

1. Exhibitors must be Members of the Society, 10 Years of age or over, except in classes where otherwise defined i.e., open classes or shows.
2. Exhibitors, if they wish to be provided with Schedules and Entry Forms, must specifically ask to be given copies of the same.
3. Amateur – a person who, not being a professional, maintains a garden or grows plants, flowers, fruit or vegetables for pleasure and enjoyment and not for his or her livelihood.
4. All entries should be made on the appropriate entry form.
5. Only one entry may be made in each class unless the Schedule provides otherwise.
6. Exhibitors must forward to the Horticultural Secretary, not later than the date specified in the Schedule, a list of the flowers, fruit or vegetables they intend to exhibit, giving the number of the class or classes in which, they intend to compete.
7. Exhibitor cards with the entry number and class number in which it is competing, will be given to each exhibitor on entering the place of exhibition.
8. Exhibitors are requested to be particular in placing their entry cards, which must be placed by the exhibitor correctly adjacent to their exhibit. The Horticultural Department will not be responsible for any error in placing the cards.
9. Elected Stewards will, if asked, assist exhibitors in the placing of their exhibits.
10. No exhibit, once brought to the place of exhibition, may be removed without the prior permission of the Horticultural Secretary. Exhibits must be staged by the time specified in the Schedule.
11. Exhibitors wishing to send collections to the place of exhibition on the day before the Show must arrange with the Horticultural Secretary, for their receipt and safe keeping. The Horticultural Department, whilst undertaking all reasonable care, does not accept responsibility for loss or damage to any exhibit and does not undertake to stage any exhibit.
12. All plants must have been in the ownership of the exhibitor for at least two months prior to the Show. The Exhibitor must have grown all cut flowers, fruit and vegetables or they will not be eligible to compete for the prize, except where marked otherwise in the Schedule.
13. All plants, cut flowers and vegetables must be distinct and named where possible and in the cases of equality, preference will be given to those exhibits which comply with this regulation. Seedlings and sports must be described as such.

14. All plants, cut flowers, fruit and vegetables exhibited must be clean and free of disease and pests. Any that are not, will be removed from the Show Bench to be collected by the owner who will be notified.
15. Exhibitors are invited to show unusual, new or newly introduced cultivars or plants, whether or not mentioned in the Show Schedule on the Members' Table.
16. The Horticultural Department shall have entire control of all exhibits from the time of their staging at the place of exhibition until the close of the Show.
17. The Committee of the Horticultural Department of the Society elects Judges.
18. Anyone elected as a Judge in a Show will be unable to make entries in that particular Show.
19. The place of exhibition will be closed promptly at 6.45pm on the evening before the Show unless otherwise specified. All exhibitors must have vacated the premises by that time.
20. No person, not being an Official, may remain in the place of exhibition whilst the Judges are officially engaged.
21. The place of exhibition may be opened early in the morning of the day of the Show by arrangement with the Horticultural Secretary.
22. Judging of Fruit, Vegetables and Flowers will be according to the RHS Guidelines.
23. If a given class shall only have one competing entry, it shall not receive a prize or commendation unless, in the opinion of the Judges, it is deserving of one.
24. Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show will only be awarded to exhibits grown by the exhibitor i.e., Fruit, Vegetables, Flowers but not Flower Arranging or Cakes etc.
25. The decision of the Judges as to the merit of an exhibit shall be final. The Horticultural Department reserves the right to remove for further inspection any specimens or plants which are the subject of a dispute. The decision of the Judges shall be final, except in cases when, after an award is made, the exhibit is found not to be in accordance with the Schedule.
26. All matters of protest, disqualification etc **MUST** be lodged with the Horticultural Secretary no later than close of the first day of the Show, when they will be dealt with by an adjudicator appointed by the Horticultural Department whose judgement which shall be based on the RHS criteria and shall be final.
27. All prize money shall be available one month after each Show to collect from the Department's offices.
Any prize money not claimed by 31st December shall be forfeited.

28. DATA PROTECTION

The Royal Jersey Agricultural & Horticultural Society complies with all Data Protection Legislation and any information we hold is not shared with any third parties but your name may be attributed to a photograph in our publications and listed in Show Results. If you wish to see a copy of our Privacy Policy, please contact the Office.

Important Notices for all Exhibitors

- All judging of flowers, fruit and vegetables will be according to RHS guidelines.
- The closing date for entries for this show is **Thursday 11th August 2021** – entries received after this date cannot be accepted. Entry Forms are included at the back of the Schedule
- Please post Entry Forms to Rachelle Robinson, RJA&HS, Royal Jersey Showground, La Route de la Trinité, Trinity JE3 5JP or email rachelle@royaljersey.co.uk
- Exhibitors may only enter one exhibit per class.
- Please name all flower specimens, vegetables, fruit and plants wherever possible as it makes the Show more interesting for visitors.
- One plant per pot unless otherwise stated.
- Where pot sizes are stated, please measure the interior diameter of the rim.
- Please use clean pots and saucers when exhibiting pot plants.
- The Summer Flower & Produce Show will be taking place in the Main Exhibition Hall.
- Exhibits may stage their entries at the place of exhibition on:
 - **Thursday 18th August from 2pm to 6pm**
 - **Friday 19th August from 7am to 6.30pm**
- Judging will start promptly at 7pm on Friday 19th August and exhibitors MUST vacate the Exhibition Hall by 6.45pm please.
- Please ensure your Exhibitor Card is displayed with your entry.
- Exhibitor Cards are in a brown envelope marked with the exhibitor's name, on a table in the place of exhibition. The Show Stewards will be there to help you if you have any queries.
- Exhibitors are reminded that they are responsible for their exhibits prior to judging. Exhibitor cards and exhibits must be placed correctly on the show bench ready for the Judge's Inspection, to avoid being given 'Not According to Schedule'. This is *not* the responsibility of the Show organisers.
- Prize Certificates will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, 3rd and Commended awards.
- Prize money of £2 will be awarded to all 1st prize winners unless otherwise specified.
- **An auction of the cakes in all the cake classes will take place at 3.30pm on Sunday 21st August and the proceeds will be donated to the Jersey Brain Tumour Charity.**
- **The Prize Giving will take place after the Cake Auction at 4.15pm on Sunday 21st August.**
- Please collect your exhibit after the Show, between 5pm and 6pm on Sunday. Any exhibits not collected by 6pm on Sunday will be left unsupervised, near the RJA&HS entrance for collection. The organisers accept no liability for any missing items that have not been collected by 6pm on Sunday.
- No exhibit, once introduced into the place of exhibition, shall be allowed to be removed prior to 5pm on Sunday, *without the sanction of the Secretary.*

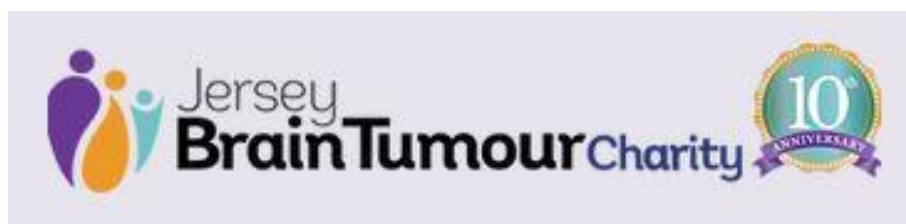
